Headlice - Treatment and Prevention

Please can you check your child's hair for headlice at least once a week. This is important in order to make sure that the source of infection is always managed. Local expert advice supports treatment with the Wet Combing Method - at least a weekly check of wet hair at hair wash time to detect headlice using a good quality detection comb and any conditioner. If live lice are detected this method should be used every 3 days for 2-3 weeks in order to prevent re-infection. If you find someone in your family has headlice, it is important to inform all close contacts. Please can we also ask that children come to school with their hair tied up as this can limit transmission from child to child. Thanks.

Safeguarding Awareness for Parents & Carers

Keeping Children Safe in Sport - **NSPCC**: Sport is a fantastic thing for children and young people. It helps them socialise, keeps them fit and more importantly can introduce them into an interest for life. One which will increase their quality of life far into the future, setting good habits and instilling values and self-discipline. Engaging with them in this manner can show them new directions for their lives and expand their opportunities. However, like with anything, there are risks, for example away matches; interactions with non-school staff such as coach drivers; out-of-school coaches and other personnel, which can create vulnerability. PE and School Sport
