


MARAZION SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 23rd February 2023

In/Out of School

PE and School Sport

Spring PE Days: Bristol Bus (Year R/1): Monday and Thursday; Notting Hill (Year 1/2): Monday and Thursday; Invictus (Year 3/4): Tuesday and Wednesday; Clement's Inn (Year 5): Monday and Wednesday; Stonewall (Year 6): Monday and Wednesday. Fixtures and Events: Team training for girls and boys in KS2 continues in school on Tuesdays and Thursdays (weather dependent). Next week some Year 5/6 boys and girls are taking part in the Leading Edge Football Cup and children in Years 4/5/6 are attending the last local Cross-Country event. Letters have already gone out. See below for dates and times. Swimming Sessions: This half term some children in Years 3, 4 and 6 are going swimming - this includes our 'continuing swimmers.' If your child is going swimming, you will receive a text message to confirm that they are swimming the day before (Tuesday). Pupils need swimming kit (black costume or trunks - not board shorts) and goggles (if you have them) as well as a £1 contribution towards the cost of the sessions. School provides swimming caps. Thanks. There is a LATER pick up @ 4pm for children who are swimming. Gym Sessions: From NEXT Monday 27th February, Bristol Bus (BB) are going to Penzance Gym. Please can children in BB come to school in their PE kit on Mondays. A reminder that all children need to wear a t-shirt that has no buttons to the gym. Thanks. Optional PE Homework: For February homework, we would like you to try a new sport or activity which can be inside or outside of school. Why not go for a short brisk walk; take part in a Joe Wicks workout twice a week or do a beach clean?
