Dear Parents,

We are now including any relevant safeguarding awareness information for parents in our weekly newsletters. Last week there were details of a Football Association safeguarding course for parents. The course is designed to help parents make informed choices about the football settings where they enrol their children, helping parents recognise best practice and see where there may be concerns, so that they can report them quickly and effectively. This week we have a focus on online safety as children start the new year with new devices that they have received as Christmas gifts (see below).

Marazion Christmas Fundraising

Thank you to everyone that came along and supported our Christmas Fair and events over the festive period. We received amazing prizes for the raffle; wonderful donations to the tombola; stalls brimming with beautiful gifts and plenty of pennies were spent. We raised a massive £856.17 - what a HUGE success! Marazion Clubs - Spring Term

Marazion Clubs start NEXT Monday 16th January - clubs are open to children in Year 1 to Year 6. After School Marazion Clubs run from 3-3.45pm, except for Rock Band, which runs from 3-4.30pm. Please note that *Dodgeball* club is oversubscribed so will run for 2 groups of children over 5 weeks.

2023 Year 6 London Residential Visit: Tuesday 14th to Friday 18th March

In 2023 we are capping the cost of the London Residential visit at £250. Children in Year 6 are fundraising to raise money to cover the difference of any higher cost for every child (see above). In/Out of School

Marazion School Reading Room (RR): Children can choose to come into school and read for pleasure from 8.30-8.45am every day. Notting Hill are hosting the sessions next week. Marazion School Uniform: Children need to wear school uniform/PE uniform Monday to Thursday. Our school uniform is a white t-shirt/polo shirt/shirt with dark (grey/black) joggers/trousers/shorts/skirts/pinafores with a school jumper/cardigan. Our PE uniform is similar - white t-shirt with dark joggers/shorts and warmer layers for autumn/winter PE Days. Children also need to wear black comfortable shoes/trainers for PE Days. Forest Fridays (FFs): Adults and children wear comfortable clothes that they do not mind getting dirty on Fridays. These clothes must also be suitable for working outside. School Visits: A reminder that school visit information is now sent to parents by email from their child's class teacher. Stonewall have their launch of this term's learning next week as well as a visit to All Saint's church in Marazion.

Safeguarding Awareness - Child Safety and the Metaverse

Christmas presents have been exchanged and a new year has begun. Many children will have been given devices which allow both unrestricted access to the internet and expose children to voice chat, text chat and photo sharing with complete strangers. This year presents an acceleration of this vulnerability window as VR headsets, connected to Facebook's Metaverse, have been released on to the marketplace. The Metaverse seeks to link users to the internet as a Virtual Entity through the use of Virtual Reality Headsets. This amplifies the danger children are exposed to online.
