


MARAZION SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 20th April 2023

In/Out of School

Marazion School Reading Room (RR): Children can choose to come into school and read for pleasure from 8.30-8.45am every day. Stonewall are hosting reading sessions next week. Out of School Celebrations: Every week during Celebration Assembly, we celebrate the wonderful things that children have completed outside of school. This could be moving up a stage in swimming; getting a badge in Brownies or Scouts; being man/woman of the match. If your child has something to share, they can celebrate it on Thursdays with all of us. School Events: FUNKY Forest Fridays (FFs): We are currently trialing some changes to our afternoon KS2 Forest Friday sessions to make them more funky. Children will again work in vertical groups (Year 3 to Year 6) taking part in 6 sessions over 6 weeks. For this half term, while we organise the new Funky Forest Fridays, children are working on a D and T project, as a class group. Please note that adults and children still need to wear comfortable outdoor clothes that they do not mind getting dirty on Fridays. Art Day: Clement's Inn are launching this term's learning with an Art Day next Friday 28th April. Please can children wear clothes that they do not mind getting messy. Thanks. School Visits: School visit information is sent to parents by email from their child's class teacher. Next week Invictus are doing a Beach Clean.

PE and School Sport

Summer PE Days: Please have a look at this term's PE days as there are some changes. Bristol Bus (Year R/1): Thursday; Notting Hill (Year 1/2): Monday and Tuesday; Invictus (Year 3/4): Monday and Wednesday; Clement's Inn (Year 5): Monday and Wednesday; Stonewall (Year 6): Monday and Wednesday. Fixtures and Events: Team training for girls and boys in KS2 continues in school on Tuesdays and Thursdays (weather dependent). Next week, children in Year 5 and 6 are taking part in the PPE Football Cluster Cup - both girls' and boys' teams. Please see below for date and time. Letters are going out today. Swimming Sessions: This half term some children in Years 3, 4 and 6 are going swimming - this includes our 'continuing swimmers'. If your child is going swimming, you will receive a text message to confirm that they are swimming the day before (Tuesday). Pupils need swimming kit (black costume or trunks - not board shorts) and goggles (if you have them) as well as a £1 contribution towards the cost of the sessions. School provides swimming caps. Thanks. There is a LATER pick up @ 4pm for children who are swimming. Gym Sessions: Notting Hill (NH) are going to Penzance Gym on Monday afternoons. Please can children in NH come to school in their PE kit on Mondays. A reminder that all children need to wear a t-shirt that has no buttons to the gym. Thanks. Optional PE Homework: For April homework, we are asking everyone to try and walk to school...not all the way...just to try to walk more of the way.
