Dear Parents,

Our summer residentials start next week with children in Year 3 going to Porthpean on Thursday 9th to Friday 10th May. Hopefully, there will be some sunshine! Household Support Fund

The entitlement criteria for automatic payments from the Household Support Fund is changing. In order to be entitled to a payment from the Household Support Fund scheme in 2024, you must be responsible for at least one child and on 3rd June 2024 either:

- be entitled to Council Tax Support OR
- have been placed in emergency accommodation by the Council

You will receive £80 per child. If you are already in receipt of Council Tax Support, then you don't have to do anything else – you will receive your payment automatically. To find out if you are eligible for Council Tax Support, please check the information by following link below:

2024 Residential Visits (RV)

We are sending regular texts as reminders about payment for residential visits - the dates when costs must be paid in full are below. Many thanks to all of you who have already paid in full or have started instalment plans. Please contact the Group Leader of your child's RV if you have any queries or you require any further information. Please contact the School Office for information about costs for pupil premium children.

Oxford (Year 6), Tuesday 21st to Friday 24th May – Group Leader is Lewis Groom. The cost of this visit is £110, which must be paid in full by NEXT Friday 10th May.

Isles of Scilly (IOS), Monday 10th to Friday 14th June - Please note the change of Group Leader for IOS, which is now Jenny Rainbow. The cost of this visit is approximately £265 (final cost to be confirmed), which must be paid in full by Friday 24th May. Installment cards have been available from January 2024 to support paying the cost weekly/monthly. Please speak to Ed or Tamsyn in the office if you require any further information about payment for IOS RV. Please note that the Parental Consent Form will be sent out after half term and the Kit List before half term.
