Safeguarding Awareness for Parents & Carers

The Hidden Dangers of scanning QR Codes - Action Fraud warns that fake QR codes are being used to trick people into giving away personal or financial information. Legitimate QR codes in car parks are replaced with scam versions and other QR codes are sent as malicious codes via email in phishing attacks known as 'quishing'. To stay safe, only scan QR codes from trusted sources, avoid using third-party scanning apps, and double-check links before following them.
