Weekly Times Tables Recall Rhyme

Safeguarding Awareness for Parents & Carers

Keeping Children Safe in Sport - **NSPCC**: Sport is a fantastic thing for children and young people. It helps them socialise, keeps them fit and more importantly can introduce them into an interest for life. One which will increase their quality of life far into the future, setting good habits and instilling values and self-discipline. Engaging with them in this manner can show them new directions for their lives and expand their opportunities. However, like with anything, there are risks, for example away matches; interactions with non-school staff such as coach drivers; out-of-school coaches and other personnel, which can create vulnerability.
