


# MARAZION SCHOOL NEWSLETTER 25th May 2023

## Dear Parents,

We have had super sunny weather for the last week of this half term so we have attached our Sun Protection Policy electronically to this newsletter. Please can you review it. Please note that ideally children should have access to their own *named* sunhat in school during the spring and summer months and a wide-brimmed hat that covers the face, neck and ears. Children are encouraged to apply sunscreen before school starts with a UVA protection of 4 stars or above and sun protection factor (SPF) of at least 30. Children are encouraged to bring in sun cream for application at lunchtime and school visits. Please also note that staff will apply sunscreen to children as and when is necessary. This includes both in school and on school visits. Parents must inform the school if they do not want a staff member to apply sunscreen. #### Safeguarding Awareness for Parents & Carers

A reminder of last week's safeguarding information for parents as vaping has been a major topic in the news over the last 2 weeks. Vaping Concerns - Welsh Senedd: as educational professionals, particularly in the secondary school sector, you will have likely caught your older pupils smoking. It is an occurrence that has been part of teaching older pupils since time immemorial. The issues related to smoking in general, particularly on those without fully developed bodies, have been well documented. An increased vulnerability to heart-disease, cancer, dental issues etc, is an almost universally understood effect. Yet vaping is becoming a far more prevalent way for teenagers to exercise their desire to experiment with dangerous substances. Vaping devices are brightly coloured, come in multiple flavors from bubblegum to strawberry, and are packaged in a 'cool' way. All aspects highly attractive to younger age groups. There is a misconception that vaping is less dangerous, but that couldn't be further from the truth. Last year the Welsh Senedd published a report on the effects of vaping in children and teens. # Hedgerow Safety

Now that the weather has been sunny the hedgerows are blossoming with all sorts of wonderful flowers. Lots of us love to pick flowers, including picking them for making potions. Please remember that our lovely Cornish hedgerows include foxgloves, which are poisonous and can make us very poorly so if touched hands must be washed. We must never pick these. Also, hogweed has white flowers, which when touched or pressed causes an oil / liquid (sap) to be released that can cause very serious burns to the skin. This sap is in the stalks and leaves rather that the flower. Please see the photos sent out electronically with this newsletter as a reminder of what foxgloves and hogweed look like.

Marazion School Playing field: Please note that the playing field is an area that is OUT OF BOUNDS for ALL dogs at ALL times. Many thanks. Marazion School Reading Room (RR): Children can choose to come into school and read for pleasure from 8.30-8.45am every day. Stonewall are hosting reading sessions next week. School Events: FUNKY Forest Fridays (FFs): We are currently trialing some changes to our afternoon KS2 Forest Friday sessions to make them more funky. Children will again work in vertical groups (Year 3 to Year 6) taking part in 6 sessions over 6 weeks. For this half term, while we organise the new Funky Forest Fridays, children are working on a D and T project, as a class group. Please note that adults and children still need to wear comfortable outdoor clothes that they do not mind getting dirty on Fridays. School Events: Staff and children from MBA are visiting Year 5 children during the first week back to discuss life at secondary school and NH and BB have a Mazey Day workshop. School Visits: During the first week back, Stonewall are hosting an Outcome, celebrating their spring learning and Bristol Bus are out taking part in an 'under the sea' workshop. #### PE and School Sport

Swimming Sessions: After half term some children in Years 3, 4 and 6 are going swimming - this includes our 'continuing swimmers'. Pupils need swimming kit (black costume or trunks - not board shorts) and goggles (if you have them) as well as a £1 contribution towards the cost of the sessions. School provides swimming caps. Thanks. There is a LATER pick up @ 4pm for children who are swimming. Gym Sessions: Notting Hill (NH) are still going to Penzance Gym on Monday afternoons after half term. Please can children in NH come to school in their PE kit on Mondays. A reminder that all children need to wear a t-shirt that has no buttons to the gym. Thanks.
