Equipment Needed

This term's learning Key Question: Medicine-science or art?

Our topic for this term is medicine, front-line emergence services and how our bodies work. This is a Science based topic. Our launch for this topic is a medical day where we will dress up as doctors and complete a selection of medical themed tasks and challenges to immerse ourselves in our new topic. We are also exploring who Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale were and discussing why, as a nation, we know one better than the other.

In Literacy we are covering a range of genres linked to our topic including newspaper articles around a new discovery and medical disaster; information text about how, when and why we should (or should not) access emergency service help; poetry and story writing. Our class novel is 'Pig Heart Boy' by Malorie Blackman.

In **Maths** sessions, we are looking at: fractions, decimals, percentages, multiplication and division. We are focussing on fluency in these areas as well as improving our reasoning and problem-solving skills.

Physical Education: we are working on a range of invasion sports such as hockey, handball and swimming. We are also working on our physical conditioning with HIIT and Yoga.
History: we are learning about famous people such as: Hippocrates, Fleming, Mary Seacole, Marie Curie, Nobel, Henry Grey and their historical legacy, using a variety of reliable sources to gain a deeper understanding of historical events.

Science: we are learning about our bodies; what keeps us healthy; electrical circuits; natural resources and where they come from; the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the ways our body function.

Music: we are learning to play the Ukulele, 'remembering songs' about the human body and its systems and we are taking part in

Art and Design: we are creating graffiti art on surgical sheets in the style of Basquiat and creating cross stitch hearts.

Computing: we are learning how to stay safe online and looking at coding using micro bits. **RE:** we are learning about the Jesus, the Holy Trinity in addition to Hindu traditions and believes.



Children are expected to read for twenty minutes at home every evening after school. The children should record this in their homework diary and have an adult sign it. Pupils in Deltas are completing a spelling investigation every week. They will be given a list of spellings which follow a rule and will be tested on these every Monday, along with two 'mystery spellings' which follow the same rule. This supports children's understanding of the spelling rule. We focus on a specific times table each week as a class. Children can bring blank tests home to practise. Throughout this term the children will be signposted to a range of apps and websites to practise spelling and arithmetic.
