Autumn 2023 Themes

Safeguarding Awareness for Parents & Carers

How OFSTED Inspects Safeguarding: During recent training around how Ofsted inspect safeguarding, inspectors were clear that schools are only a part of the system that is in place to keep children safe and that 'schools cannot be everything to everyone.' For example, they recognise that school leaders are not trained social workers. Ofsted are clear that they have no intention of trying to 'catch schools out on technicalities'. Ofsted does not expect anything from schools beyond that which is set out in 'Keeping Children Safe in Education' (KCSIE) documents and their school policies and protocols. Ofsted are very much looking for a culture of safeguarding - they 'expect all schools to have an open and positive culture around safeguarding that put pupils' interests first'. Inspectors will use a range of evidence to evaluate the effectiveness of safeguarding arrangements. Ofsted say that an important aspect of inspection and safeguarding is to be assured that the school is 'reflective and receptive to challenge' and that staff understand that safeguarding is an 'ongoing endeayour'.

PE and School Sport

PE Days: Children come to school in PE kits on the days they have Games Afternoons/PE sessions. Autumn PE Days for each class are: Curious Clouds (Year R/1): Thursday; Rivers (Year 1/2): Monday and Tuesday; Luxulyan Valley (Year 3/4): Wednesday and Friday; Deltas (Year 4/5): Thursday and Friday; Tectonics (Year 6): Wednesday and Friday. Fixtures and Events: Next week some children in Years 4-6 are taking part in a Boys' Football Festival and some Year 5 and 6 children are attending a Tag Rugby event. Letters for both were sent out yesterday. Please see below for dates and times. Swimming Sessions: Some Year 6 pupils will continue with their swimming sessions on Wednesday afternoons. You will receive a text message on Tuesday if your child is going swimming. A reminder that pick up is LATER at 4pm from the playing field. Pupils need swimming kit (black costume or rash vest/trunks - not board shorts) and goggles (if you have them) as well as a £1 contribution towards the cost of the sessions. School provides swimming caps. Thanks. Gym Sessions: There are no gym sessions this half term. Optional PE Homework: For November, we are asking you to dance like no one is watching to some happy tunes.
